SUGGESTED SEQUENCE OF COURSES

This model is a two-year course schedule (leading to an A.A.S. degree) for students meeting all program requirements and deciding to pursue full-time study. Schedules will be redesigned for those requiring preparatory courses or those deciding to pursue part-time study.

FIRST YEAR

Fall Semester 15-16 Credits

- COL 105 - Academic Planning Seminar (or SAC or LRS)
- ENG 110, ENG 150 or ENG 111- College Writing I or Technical Writing or College Writing II if advised
- Mathematics General Education approved course, or Math developmental course as needed or Lab Science course
- Social/Behavioral Science course
- Professional or Technical or Concentration courses

Spring Semester 15-16 Credits

- Mathematics General Education approved course (only if developmental math was needed in First Semester) or Lab Science course
- First General Education selection: Foreign Language, The ARTS, Western or Other World Civilization, or U.S. History
- Professional or Technical or Concentration courses (include one WE course)
- Physical Education – must have cardiovascular attribute

SECOND YEAR

Fall Semester 15-16 Credits

- Social/Behavioral Science course with a Civic Ed attribute
- Second General Education selection: Choose one from Foreign Language, the ARTS, Western or Other World Civilization, or U.S. History
- Professional or Technical or Concentration courses (include one WE course)

Spring Semester 15-16 Credits

- ENG 220 - Communicating About Ideas and Values
- Professional or Technical or Concentration courses

MINIMUM GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: 63
