Question: Why are these courses not going through the same process as the regular Gen Ed courses?

There is a difference between the application of Gen Ed in infused courses compared to pure Gen Ed education. This, combined with the tight timeline we have to approve courses before the deadline for the catalog is why the shortened process has been proposed and approved:

Courses will present at Gen Ed and then the Gen Ed committee with send a memo to Curriculum Committee and the VPAA sharing our recommendations for approval, revisions, or non-approval. The course proposer to revise the course, if needed, but will also be allowed to move directly to Curriculum Committee for a vote there, regardless of our recommendation. The VPAA will have the opportunity to review any changes made, or not, to the course and ultimately approve it or not.

VIII. Call for New Business

SUNY framework was put together by a large group of faculty regarding what is best for our students. Every class A. Glenn teaches is a Gen Ed course – so everyday he thinks about what he can give his students who are from outside of majors. This has caused him to thinking about what Gen Ed means – students see them as being 'in the way'. It isn't just about the professor teaching students something in a different way – students are in courses with people across the campus and they learn from each other just as much as they do from their professors. Thinking about all of this, A. Glenn look at what SUNY has put forward in their new framework in terms of the required core categories and competencies: Do we need think about the committee make-up given the new standards?

C. Martey-Ochola - balance of study and wrap-around knowledge is difficult and important. As we have this dialog, we should be thinking about who else could be around the table.
